## A Special Chair to Honor POWs/MIAs

TRITON REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT – Next Spring at the graduation of the high school class of 2023 or in the fall when Triton is playing a rival football team, the stadium on the Triton campus may have standing room only. People may have to lean against the fence because there is not a single seat in the stadium vacant – except for one.

But that seat is “sacred,” said Marine veteran Michael Vanderslice, a Triton Spanish teacher. The seat, cordoned off with a permanent sign explaining its significance, was dedicated by the administration, students and faculty the day before Veterans Day to honor the 82,000 soldiers who are never coming home after being a prisoner of war or missing in action in wars since World War II.

It is one of the few chairs that honor POWs and MIAs in high school football stadiums across the country.

“What you do today is critically important,” newly reelected state Sen. Bruce Tarr, who represents the Triton community and much of the North Shore, told the students. “It is inspirational. I am proud to be with you.”

Tarr said of the POWs/MIAs, “We express our love for them, our loyalty to them. We will never, ever forget them.”

The ceremony, organized by

junior Douglas Aylward, who was the master of ceremonies, featured several students who read poems about the value of sacrifice, honor and loyalty, sang the National Anthem and closed the ceremony with taps. Students, faculty and the school’s grounds crew also set up the stage and brought the public address system.

On the Marine Corps’ 247th birthday, Vanderslice said, “We choose to say here is a special place, a sacred space.” He told the story of a sailor during World War II, who gave up his life in a damaged submarine so other sailors could

## Nova Kakhovka, Ukraine On the Front Lines

REGIONAL – For those who fly the Ukrainian flag, the liberation of the city of Kherson has brought joy during this holiday season. But for Jarrod & Nadiia Sadowski, who live and work on Plum Island, it has brought new challenges as they try to send food and money to the residents of her hometown, Nova Kakhovka, including her parents.

“Since November 11th, as the entire north side of the Kherson Oblast Region was liberated, Nova Kakhovka became a front-line city,” Jarrod wrote last week to North Shore friends and supporters.

Nova Kakhovka, once a thriving city up the Dnieper River about an hour from Kherson, has been occupied by Russian troops since early in the war. “But now, Nova Kakhovka is in a critical situation” Jarrod wrote. “As Ukraine army

moves forward (south toward the city) attacking Russians logistics and ammunition depots from a distance, Russians become more aggressive, which puts more risks for the people in the city and the entire Kherson region.”

Many of the volunteers, who were buying and delivering food with donations collected by the Sadowski, have left the city. The city, once with 45,000 residents, has only 15,000 residents left, many of whom live in bomb shelters or like her parents sleep on mattresses in their building’s hallway.

The Russians, feeling threatened by the Ukrainian army, control the hospitals, but have become more aggressive, questioning anyone who is caught on the streets. “We try to imagine how this must feel being a

continue to have oxygen. In front of American, POW/MIA and Triton flags, the stage included a Missing Man table. As explained by students David Pugh and Parker Heritgan, the small table stood as a symbol for the soldier who was alone and suffering an unknown fate and for their families who would never know their fate.

Participating students included Abigail Rainsford and Cameron Neary, who read poems and Izzy Oldoni, who read an essay. Marvens Pierre-Jules, Colin Webber and Daniel Jones sang the National Anthem. Andrea Boyle and Aaron Hoscher closed the ceremony playing taps on their trumpets.

Don Jarvis, a Triton graduate and Army veteran of the Afghanistan and

Iraq wars, donated the chair, working with Karen Taylor, the veterans agent, and Tracy Goodwin.

Wanda Codair, a Marine veteran, Bob Brislin, a Navy Veteran, and Army veteran Sy Chaimovich unveiled the chair.

Aylward was recognized by Tarr with a proclamation from the state Senate recognizing his contribution to the event.

prisoner in your own home, living in an atmosphere of anxiety day and night. It is no less than terrifying," Jarrod wrote.

The couple found new volunteers in October to distribute the food that is now twice or three times the price. They also send money to help those who are desperate.

Once the volunteers buy food or supply, they send a receipt to the Sadowski

so they have a record of when and what was purchased. "So far this is working out, and we hope we can continue to help in purchasing more food and essentials for people in need," Jarrod wrote.

"With your support our hope is to continue helping those remaining in Nova Kakhovka, by providing the much-needed funds to purchase food and essentials each and every day," he wrote.

The Sadowskis have held three fundraising dinners where they and their families prepared and served traditional Ukrainian dishes. The dinners have been held at the Custom House in Newburyport and at Pub 97 in Groveland.

## **Wintertime Selling**

I know. I know. It's not winter yet. But as we turn on the heat for the first time this week, we all know it is coming. Most of us with the exception of skiers, snowboarders, shovel and snowplow makers don't particularly care for winter. Winter brings cold, snow and often a challenging time to sell your home. This is why it is especially important to maintain strong curb appeal throughout the winter.

Curb appeal is the first impression people get. Due to the number of real estate websites, it is much easier to get addresses of homes. Therefore, although we can say "this home isn't a drive by", the fact is people looking to buy a home can dismiss yours simply by driving by. If you haven't bothered to move snow away from the front porch, entry ways or deck, or if your home is cluttered on the outside, people are going to assume that it is a mess inside. If the gutters are full or falling off the person driving by is going to assume that the house needs work inside. This might not be fair or accurate, but it happens. Although the fixes below are geared around wintertime, many are applicable year round:

**Get rid of the snow:** Move it away from your walkways and driveway. Don't wait for me to call to say "we have a request for a showing" to shovel the back steps or deck. When you get a call for a showing be ready and have a clear path to the door. I can't tell you how many times I have had to shovel a walkway right before the potential buyer gets there. Keep in mind that all the upgrades inside the house are worthless if we can't get buyers inside. You may have spent money putting in a new vanity or painting the bedrooms, but if you don't get rid of the snow, we won't be able to get people inside, so stay on top of snow removal.

**Check the heating system:** Have the heating system serviced. It shows buyers that

you care about the upkeep of your home. Fireplaces and wood burning stoves should also be cleaned on a regular basis.

**Test fire and carbon monoxide detectors:** These won't be checked until your REALTOR® brings the fire department through, but for your own safety check them regularly.

**Check the roof:** Look for damaged or loose shingles, gaps in the flashing as well as damaged mortar around the chimney. Check the roof periodically after storms to make sure you don't have too much snow up there. Proactive maintenance can prevent emergencies and expensive repairs.

**Mold:** Go up in the attic and look around for mold on the roof sheathing. If you see what you think might be mold call a remediation company to see about removal. Most remediation companies will offer some type of warranty. This will give buyers the confidence it won't return and if it does can be remedied without costing them money.

**Maintain steps and handrails:** It is great that you got all the snow off the steps but make sure there are no broken steps and or loose railings.

**Shut down outside water:** Shut down outside faucets and make sure you drain the lines so no water can freeze, expand and burst a pipe. If you have a small pool that can come inside, bring it in.

It doesn't take much effort or even money in most cases to improve your curb appeal during the winter time. If you get rid of that snow from entry ways to the house and follow the simple fixes above, you will have buyers with snow covered boots walking all over your clean carpets in no time and maybe even a sale!!!

sense than throwing money away to fund the insurance company's pocketbooks.

Another thing to consider as the end of the year approaches is the use of flex spending accounts. Many employers now offer pre-tax flex spending accounts for healthcare expenses. Often underutilized, these are excellent mechanisms for saving about 20 percent on needed dental care. If you are paying for your dental insurance premiums, it may even make sense to fund an available flex spending account with that premium money instead of, or in conjunction with it.

For instance, if you are anticipating the need for \$3000 in dental care, opting to place the \$3000 in a flex spending account can save the income tax on those monies and can usually be used as soon as January 1st. If you have money left in a flex spending account, remember to check with your employer to determine if that money needs to be used by the end of the year.




