### Chaco Canyon & Aztec National Monument: The Center of the World 1,000 Years Ago

Chaco Cultural National Historical Park and Aztec Ruins National Monument preserve major centers of Ancestral Pueblo culture, dating between 850 and 1250CE. would have a heart attack if he continued to work at Town Hall.

Rachel Bancroft, vice chair of the ConCom said. "He was driven out." She said Przyjemski was targeted by Pacheco. The way he was treated was "a real shock to Steve."

Relations between Przyjemski and Pacheco became so heated the conservation agent filed a police report because the town administrator was yelling at and threatening him. According to the report, Pacheco tried to force open his locked office door. The issue was discussed with the members Selectmen in an executive session.

Pacheco said Przyjemski "was not pressured (to resign), although personally I do think he was used to Mr. Farrell's management style and preferred it." Pacheco succeeded Mike Farrell as administrator in October 2021.

Dawes intervened, asking for civility.

Przyjemski leaves the job on Thursday, but has offered to continue helping the town process applications for permits by residents and builders on weekends and evenings. "If Pacheco will let him," said Shredder.

He said last week he is considering several jobs, but has not decided where he will work next.

Choosing conservation agent is likely to be acrimonious in the current environment. "The battle begins," Bancroft

Shredder believes Pacheco will try to keep the commission from hiring a new agent, although that is required by state law, and will try to hire his own conservation agent, he said.

"Pacheco has been hinting that he does not believe a full-time agent is needed," Shredder said.

In his email, Pacheco wrote, "In the entire year of 2022, only 2 projects (of 15 active projects) that filed with the Conservation Commission were commercial 91 & 93 Tenney Street, which were small commercial buildings and of the 15 active hearings for the entire year 7 were septic systems replacements which come already reviewed by the Board of Health."

said, "The need was so urgent, we could not sit idly by. People kept asking 'why not the kids?' We took it on."

Kael Brooks, the CATCH clinical supervisor, spent the last several years identifying the scope of the challenge by surveying parents and teens about their mental health. The results for the North Shore showed that 21 percent of those surveyed suffered from depression, while 11 percent reported having considered or attempted suicide.



Dental hygienists love it when they make suggestions patients about home care and their dreams are answered when the patient returns 6 months later with noticeable improvement. It might be as simple as adding a good electric toothbrush or waterpik to the patient's regimen. I would like to say that we are amazed daily by the fruits of our counseling, but that isn't the case. For whatever reasons there are, changing routines is often difficult.

Over 10 years ago I wrote a column about an article I saw in a magazine, which is apparently also a book, entitled "Change or Die". What if you were given that choice? What if the doctor said you had to make tough changes in the way you think and act - or your time would end soon? Could you change? Here are the scientifically studied odds: nine to one. That's nine to one against you. I don't think we have made much headway on this over the past 10 years.

It's a pretty common theme. As Americans, we're dying at a rapid rate from five basic self-induced health problems. We eat too much. We drink too much. We smoke too much. We have too much stress. And, we don't exercise enough. These five poor choices, manifested in scores of ailments, consume the vast majority of the nation's healthcare budget. The article is an outpouring of concern from healthcare experts and doctors, all looking for a way to change the behavior of people who love their lifestyle so much that they literally die from it.

In a Johns Hopkins study a while back, 9 of 10 heart surgery patients chose to return to their unhealthy lifestyle, rather than make the changes needed to live longer. Only a few are convinced by

daily changes. One of the more successful doctors with this is Dr. Dean Ornish, founder of the Preventive Medicine Research Institute. He says NO to meat, fatty dairy products, alcohol and oil. His vegetarian diet is lowfat, high-maintenance and strict. And, it has been shown to reverse heart disease and other factors in patients who were destined for quadruple bypasses - or worse, eternal

When 90% of patients are back to their old tricks within weeks of open-heart surgery, his program is the one making a difference. How does he do it? Well, it's easy, really. Dr. Ornish coaches his patients to make changes strictly for the benefit of making them. Instead of telling them they must change or face death, he encourages them to change so that they can enjoy the endless beauty of living. With dedicated support, threequarters of his patients are still going strong three years into

their doctors to make radical and tired of being sick and tired, usually, before you'll make the leap and let go of whatever the resistance is to change. For many, doing more preventively never happens. We wait for chest pain to strike or a toothache to occur before seeking help to solve our crisis problem. Then we hope, and many times expect, that our problem can be solved easily and not too much will have to change to prevent it from happening again.

Dr. Ornish would tell you the change must be profound. He would tell you to never have another cheeseburger. Your hygienist would say you need to follow a new strict homecare routine, radically different than what you currently do. Making changes like these has to mean more to you than the change itself. You must be invested in improving the quality of your life.
