Read to Win

TOPSFIELD - Reading has its rewards. The Topsfield Fair, Fiesta Shows and The International Association of Fairs and Expositions this summer promoted a 'Read and Win' program with at 32 libraries in Essex, Middlesex counties and southern New Hampshire.

For each elementary school student that achieves their goal, 4,148 students were rewarded with an admission ticket to the Topsfield Fair. Children under eight get in free. They also get a free hot dog and drink voucher, two ride tickets, a ribbon and certificate.

In addition to the normal fun at the Fair, the students will get the chance to see the world-famous Budweiser Clydesdales, scheduled to make several appearances at the 2023 Topsfield Fair.

The eight-horse hitch will be harnessed and hitched to the famous red beer wagon at the Topsfield Fair on Oct. 5 to 8. The "Gentle Giants," as they are often referred to, will make their way around the fairgrounds starting at 4:30 p.m on Thursday and Friday and 5:30 p.m. on Saturday.

About 20 minutes into the procession, the hitch will stop at the Topsfield Fair's Beer Garden to deliver a case of beer. The horses will also be in the Arena at 5 p.m. on Thursday and 6 p.m. on Saturday for a brief

When not on the grounds or in the Arena, the Clydesdales will be in a tent next to the Horse Barn adjacent to the Cattle Gate for attendees to visit.

Ipswich Public Health Department to Hold Flu Vaccination Clinic

IPSWICH - Public Health Director Colleen Fermon and the Ipswich Public Health Department would like to share information on this year's flu vaccination clinic, held in partnership with the Ipswich Council on Aging and Conley's Drug Store.

Ipswich residents aged 50 & up. What:

The Ipswich Public Health Department has partnered with the Council on Aging and Conley's Drug Store to offer a flu vaccination clinic for residents aged 50 and up.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends everyone six months and older get vaccinated every flu season. It takes about two weeks for protection to develop after vaccination.

Fluad Quadrivalent adjuvanted influenza vaccine (for those 65+) and Flucelvax Ouadrivalent influenza vaccine will be offered at the clinic.

Pre-registration is required and can be done through Conley's Drug Store website.

Shingles, Pneumonia, TDAP, and RSV vaccines can also be provided if chosen during the pre-registration process.

It is not uncommon to get a second opinion, or a second or third quote for things like car repairs and home improvements. When it comes to our health, it usually depends on the nature of the issue. More complex issues in medicine, such as a diagnosis of cancer, an unknown diagnosis, or other major medical issues in which we have to make decisions about significant treatment, tend to stimulate people to get more than one opinion. In dentistry, it seems that the incidence of second opinions is not as great.

Routine dental care is generally not that complicated. There are many different ways to do the simplest things in dentistry. The method is a function of the dentist's beliefs and training. It is relatively uncommon for a patient to get a second opinion for this type of maintenance dental care. Although there is some subjectivity as to what different dentists might deem as "needing" to be done, patients usually base their decision on their perceived need. This perception of need comes from the dentist's ability to communicate the reasons for treatment.

The patient's trust in their provider is a big factor. If a patient trusts and genuinely likes their dentist, they may not

what the dentist wants them to, but they are comfortable enough to make the decision on treatment. It is when there is a lack of trust, for one reason or another, that patients tend to venture out for another opinion. This lack of trust usually stems from a personality conflict or the inability of the dentist to properly communicate with the patient effectively.

Even when there are more complex dental issues, it is my feeling that patients base the need for another opinion on lack of trust. Another important factor is that the patient is given choices. Patients always have the right to choose what treatment they feel is right for themselves. If choices are given and the treatment is properly communicated to the patient, they have the ability to decide in what direction to proceed.

If a dentist properly communicates the need for treatment and the patient decides to do nothing, it is the patient's choice. It is when treatment is properly presented and it aligns with the patient's perception of need or desire, that the patient at jpstclair@stclairdmd.com

Fees tend to be a less common reason for patients to seek another opinion. Fees for treatment can definitely vary. The problem with seeking treatment based on fees is that the same treatment in two different offices with different fees can also vary in the level of expertise and precision in which it is done. There are

mean a higher quality product. Fees are generally based on the time involved, the materials used, and the perceived expertise of the provider. Be cautious when seeking treatment based on fees. The fee for treatment should definitely be considered, but the entire treatment presentation and the way in which it is communicated should be used to determine your decision.






