Where is My Coco?

REGIONAL – Deidre was excited about buying a dog from a "reputable Maltipoo breeding family." The "breeder" had sent her photos and videos of her dog and claimed on the website 1HappyMiltipoo.com that it was not a puppy mill.

The "breeder" promised to send the dog with a "nanny" from Fargo, ND, to Logan Airport after the money was sent. An excited Deidre went out and bought all the supplies the "breeder" said little Coco would need.

But after Deidre sent the \$600 by Venmo from her bank, her calls were not returned. She got no more videos. And no dog and nanny ever arrived.

Once she realized she had been scammed, she spent six hours talking to her bank, the police and the Better Business Bureau. She posted on several pet scam web sites that 1Happy-Maltipoo.com was a scam. She does not expect to ever see her money or the dog.

Deidre is one of thousands of dog lovers who are scammed each year, according to the American Kennel Club (AKC). When she called the local police department, the officer she spoke with said her father

had just been scammed when he tried to buy a dog.

AKC warns it is common to see fake listings pop up on sites like Craigslist, but some scammers are clever enough to pose as trustworthy breeders by taking personal information from unsuspecting buyers.

The good news is that there are simple tips to help dog lovers spot the red flags, making sure your experience of buying a dog much safer. In addition to these tips from the American Kennel Club, Dee's local police officer told her, "Never send money to someone you don't know."

A few red flags:

- No phone calls. A reputable breeder will always communicate with you via phone or video chat, if not in person, before selling you a puppy. Fraudulent sellers are oftentimes outside of the U.S. and may be hiding their phone number by only communicating by email.

- Copycat or stock photos. Photos of the dog or ad text can be found on multiple websites. Search for the text in the listing to see if the seller copied and pasted it from another site.

- Sketchy payment. The seller asks you to wire money or pay by gift cards. Avoid

Good Music Coming to the North Shore

REGIONAL – This fall, the North Shore can enjoy some great music from a wide variety of musicians.

Thanks to the 206th Topsfield Fair, running Oct. 4 to 14, fairgoers may feel like they are in Nashville, TN enjoying the music of the southern rock band 38 Special, plus Three Dog Night and the multi-Platinum country duo, Maddie & Tae.

Belleville Roots Concerts in Newburyport will continue its tradition of bringing great music to the North Shore. Canadian favorite Le Vent du Nord will perform at 8 p.m. Oct. 11 at the Belleville Congregational Church, and Martha Spencer, a singer-songwriter and dancer from Virginia's Blue Ridge Mountains will enthrall audiences on Nov. 16.

At the Topsfield Fair, the All-American classic band 38 Special will perform in the Grandstand at 7 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 10.

Three Dog Night, which had more top 10 hits between 1969 and 1974, will perform on the Grandstand at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 9.

The CMA and CMT Award-winning duo, Maddie Font and Taylor Kerr, who broke out in 2013 with their chart-topping counter to bro-country, *Girl In A Country Song*, will perform at 7 p.m. Friday, Oct. 11.

"We are excited to welcome Maddie & Tae to the Topsfield Fair for the first time," said James O'Brien, general manager of

the Topsfield Fair. "I know that fairgoers will enjoy this free concert and hope they come early and stay late to explore all the Topsfield Fair has to offer."

All the Topsfield Fair concerts are free with paid fair admission, which is \$20 every day. Discounted admission tickets are available at www.topsfieldfair.org through Oct. 3.

Le Vent du Nord, which has built a following in greater Newburyport, is a leading force in Québec's Francophone folk movement. The group's vast repertoire draws from both traditional sources and original compositions, while their highly rhythmic and soulful music is rooted in the Celtic diaspora.

On stage these five friends, Nicolas Boulerice, André Brunet, Réjean Brunet, Olivier Demers and André Gagné, have performed more than 2,200 concerts on four continents and released 12 albums.

Martha Spencer grew up in the musical Spencer family and learned to play the guitar, fiddle, banjo, bass, dulcimer and mandolin. But it is her dancing that audiences often cite when they talk about her performances.

Tickets cost \$40 in advance, \$45 at the door, \$10 for those 18 and under. Seating for Roots Concerts this fall is limited because all shows will be held in the stage room while the meetinghouse is undergoing renovations.

The Belleville Arts Foundation, whose

purpose is to maintain and renovate the Belleville Church, has been awarded a \$35,000 feasibility and technical assistance grant from the Massachusetts Cultural Council. This matching grant will fund a study to transform the Belleville Meetinghouse at 300 High Street into a financially and administratively self-sufficient community arts education center.

The center, while preserving the historic features of the building's exterior, will offer students, performers and audiences modern amenities and comfortable interior spaces for learning and performance.

paying a stranger using apps such as Venmo, as it is harder to get your money back if you don't get what you paid for. Paying by credit card or PayPal Goods & Services are typically the safest options.

- Price is too good to be true. Research the prices for the breed you are considering ahead of time. Purebred dogs sold at deeply discounted prices are typically frauds. If the seller says they register their dogs with a specific organization, you can call the organization to confirm.

- Breeder "badges." AKC does not distribute badges to breeders.

Speaking for hundreds of scammed dog lovers, Dee left a final voice message on the Happy Miltipoo number: "Karma is a b...."

Onesto Named Top 100 Small Business

REGIONAL – Onesto has been named one of the nation's top 100 small businesses by the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.

"This exclusive list recognizes 100 of the best and brightest small and mid-sized businesses across America, celebrated for their remarkable contributions in driving innovation, growth, and ingenuity both locally and globally," the chamber said in announcing the award.

"These businesses shine through their inspiring ideas and the ways they

overcome challenges, enrich community impact, foster vibrant company cultures, and engage customers. Join us in honoring these trailblazers who are shaping the future of small business," it wrote.

Onesto was one of only three Massachusetts firms and one of four in New England that were honored.

Starting in her West Newbury kitchen seven years ago, Jane Ciccone has created a nationwide company that sells gluten-free crackers on-line and in grocery stores.

Jane and Jesse Ciccone enjoyed the classic Italian tradition of the family

gathering for an antipasti plate before dinner. When they thought their youngest daughter was allergic to gluten, Jane refused to give up on what she described as "the delicious combination of crackers, cheese, olives and roasted veggies."

Her search for gluten-free crackers found only "overly-processed and preservative-filled options on most grocery store shelves."

She turned to creating her own recipes using what she described as "honest ingredients." Onesto, Italian for honest, was born. When she needed production space, she moved to the kitchen of a downtown church, but quickly outgrew that space.

With an office in Amesbury at CI Works, she has Onesto's gluten-free rosemary, everything and sea salt crackers baked with solar power in Vermont. They are sold in 100 percent recyclable packaging that are printed with vegetable dyes.

Parker River National Wildlife Refuge Proposes Removal of Bicycle / Pedestrian Fee

PLUM ISLAND – The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is seeking public input on a potential change to entrance fees in the fall of 2024 for Parker River National Wildlife Refuge (NWR). In accordance with the Federal Lands Recreation Enhancement Act of 2004, the proposed fee schedule for the refuge will be open for public comment.

The public comment period will last from September 18 through October 2.

The current refuge fees have been in place since 2007. Parker River NWR proposes eliminating the \$2.00 bicycle/pedestrian entrance fee per person. No fee increases or other changes to the refuge fee schedule are proposed.

Eighty percent of all money collected by the refuge from passes and permits, except for the Federal Duck Stamp, remains at the refuge to be used for visitor services and facility improvements. On average,

bicycle/pedestrian fees comprise less than 1% of the refuge's annual revenue. As such, the refuge anticipates no significant negative impacts on visitor services.

Potential positive impacts include incentivizing car-free travel to reduce congestion and emissions, and streamlining gatehouse fee collection operations, particularly when it is needed most in summer months.

Refuge Manager Matt Hillman encourages interested parties to provide feedback on the proposed fee changes. This will help the refuge gain a better perspective of the visitors who enjoy the refuge.

Ipswich Public Health Department, Council on Aging to Host Flu Shot Clinic for Residents Age 50 or Older

IPSWICH – Director of Public Health Colleen Fermon shares that the Ipswich Public Health Department and Council on Aging will be holding a flu shot clinic for residents age 50 years or older.

On Wednesday, Oct. 16, from 1-3 p.m., residents can visit the Council on Aging Cafeteria in Town Hall, 25 Green St., to receive their influenza vaccination.

Fluad Trivalent Adjuvanted Influenza vaccines (for those age 65 or older) and Flucelvax Trivalent Influenza vaccines will be offered. Vaccines will be provided by Conley's Drug Store.

COVID-19, Shingles, Pneumonia, TDAP and RSV Vaccines are also available. Multiple vaccines may be

administered at the same time. Pre-registration is required to receive any vaccinations. Residents can pre-register using the link <https://form.jotform.com/242115381176149>. The link can also be found on the Town website homepage.

Residents should bring their health insurance and Medicare cards. Those without insurance can still receive the regular dose influenza vaccine for \$40.

The Department advises residents to wear loose-fitting clothing or short sleeves to make the vaccination process efficient.

Brighter Smiles... THE END IS NEAR

September is almost over! It's crunch time to get everything done that we haven't gotten done during the rest of the year. For those with remaining dental benefits, it's also the time of year to consider utilizing those so you don't lose them.

Unused dental benefits go directly back to the insurance company, which generates hundreds and hundreds of thousands of dollars for the insurance companies each year. Dental insurance companies count on the fact that many people will not claim their \$1000 or so in benefits by the end of the calendar

year. Those with dental benefits should look for legitimate means to use these benefits before they are lost.

For example, perhaps a crown has been recommended by your dentist, but you have procrastinated about it. It would make sense to consider using those dental benefits before the end of the calendar year. This allows a whole new round of dental benefits to be used for unexpected dental needs the following year, and maximizes the value of the premiums paid.

Remember, insurance companies are in the business to make money. They don't want you to use your dental benefits. If the balance (co-payment) you will owe for the dental work that needs to be done is too much for you, consider financing options through your dental office. Most dental offices offer interest-free financing to patients for up to 12 months. Financing your balance in this way may make more financial sense than throwing money away to fund the insurance company's pocketbooks.

Another thing to consider as the end of the year approaches is the use of flex spending accounts. Many employers now offer pre-tax flex spending accounts for healthcare expenses.

Often underutilized, these are excellent mechanisms for saving about 20 percent on needed dental care. If you are paying for your dental insurance premiums, it may even make sense to fund an available flex spending account with that premium money instead of, or in conjunction with it.

For instance, if you are anticipating the need for \$3000 in dental care, opting to place the \$3000 in a flex spending account can save the income tax on those monies and can usually be used as soon as January 1st. If you have money left in a flex spending account, remember to check with your employer to determine if that money needs to be used by the end of the year. You don't want to lose that money either.

As you begin to make financial decisions for the end of this year and for the upcoming year, consider a discussion with your dental office's financial person. They are often an untapped wealth of information and can usually thoroughly and knowledgeably discuss your dental financial options with you.

And, don't wait too long. Dental office schedules get full quickly this time of year with patients trying to use dental insurance benefits and unused flex account money. Maximize your hard-earned dollars.
