### **Ipswich Public Safety Building** Racing to Town Meeting

**IPSWICH** — With a time crunch facing the architect and Public Safety Facility Committee (PSFC) to get the design and cost estimates for the new police and fire station ready for a May Town Meeting vote, the SelectBoard gave its unanimous approval for the latest design.

We are on a super tight schedule," Ted Gallante, the architect, told the SelectBoard. And PSFC chair Bob Weatherall said the architects are running slightly more than a week behind on the project timeline.

Gallante, who said there are still a lot of small features to be finalized, hopes to have cost estimates for the building ready in March, which PSFC chair Bob Weatherall predicted would require more money than what was previously thought. But they did not speculate this month on how much more the proposed building would cost.

Voters approved the new public safety building in 2021, but inflation in recent years in construction materials and upgrades have increased the projected costs. Weatherall has estimated that the final cost could reach

The proposed building will be at the intersection of Linebrook and Pineswamp roads near Our Lady of Hope Parish.

The new design was widely praised by the selectpersons with brick for the exterior around the glass truck doors of the Fire Station on one end and on the exterior for the chief's office, training and community room of the Police Station on the opposite end. Selectperson Sarah Player said the

latest design looks more like a residential building instead of a municipal block, which was one complaint voiced by residents at a series of forums. She liked using brick on about half of the front exterior and adding a front porch on the police station in the center of the proposed building.

"It makes it look more like a house," Player said.

Selectperson Linda Alexson agreed that the new design is "much better than what we had previously.'

"The sense of the board is onward," said Select Board chair Charles Surpitski, thanking the PSFC board and other town committees for their "hard work" on the building.



### More Than a Tree Drop: How One North Shore Farm Turned a Post-Holiday Problem Into a Winter Tradition of Joy, Learning, and Community

Every January, thousands of Christ- excitement and engagement, often with mas trees are dragged to curbsides or forgotten behind garages—symbols of a season that passed too quickly. But for one small family farm in Georgetown, Massachusetts, those trees tell a very

For the 8th consecutive year, Great Rock Farm, affectionately known as Goats To Go, will host its annual Christmas Tree Drop on Saturday, January 10th, from 8:30-11:30 AM, welcoming the public by reservation to take part in a joyful, educational winter tradition.

What started as a simple idea—letting goats nibble on leftover evergreens—has grown into a meaningful community event centered on animal enrichment, sustainability, and connection during the quietest time of year on

"Winter can be long and dull for both people and animals," says founder Michelle Aulson. "This event was never just about feeding goats. It's about giving our animals stimulation, giving families a reason to step outside together in January, and reminding people that small, thoughtful actions can have real impact.'

#### Why Trees Matter

Donated trees become enrichment tools for the farm's goats, sheep, llama, alpacas, and even chickens. The scent, texture, and challenge of evergreen branches create a sensory experience that encourages curiosity and movement—critical for animal wellness during colder months. While trees don't replace regular feed, they offer laughter, surprise, and plenty of photo-worthy moments.

### A Different Kind of Farm Experience

Visitors don't just drop and go. They witness firsthand how animals interact with their environment, learn why goats' warm, hard-working rumens help them thrive in winter, and see enrichment in action.

### Community at the Core

This year, the event carries special meaning: proceeds will be donated to the MSPCA, the organization from which the farm adopted six alpacas in August 2025. "Supporting the MSPCA is our way of giving back to the organization that helped grow our farm family," Aulson says. The morning also highlights local talent and organizations including Lee Biddle Music, Fainting Goat Tea, Emmaus, Inc, and Georgetown Girl Scout Troop 82937, reinforcing the farm's mission to serve as a hub for collaboration and community learning.

In a season often focused on clearing away the holidays, Goats To Go invites people to pause, reconnect, and give something back—not just to animals, but to the spirit of winter itself.


