Attempt to Oust ConCom Chair Fails

GEORGETOWN – The town's Conservation Commission (ConCom) voted 4 to 2 last Thursday that Rachel Therrien should remain as its chair.

On Friday, Town Administrator Orlando Pacheco fired Conservation Agent Michele Grenier, the ConCom's only staff, for her behaviors related to a continued March 3 meeting and for allegedly concealing a transcript of her telephone conversa-

tions prior to the meeting. (See adjacent story.)

Commission member Nick Lawler, who made the motion to replace Therrien, which was seconded by commissioner Daryl LaMonica, accused her of "dereliction of duty" and failure to lead the commission. Both Lawler and LaMonica, who are serving their first year on the ConCom, voted to remove her, falling short of the four votes the motion needed.

In a very tense meeting, punctuated

Town Administrator Fires ConCom Agent

GEORGETOWN – Town Hall is closed on Fridays, but Town Administrator Orlando Pacheco still fired Conservation Agent Michele Grenier, the lone ConCom staff that day, for unspecified behaviors related to a continued March 3 ConCom meeting. In a letter to Grenier issued via e-mail to her, she was also fired for allegedly concealing a transcript of a Zoom recording.

"He's been looking for a reason to fire me," Grenier told The Town Common.

Pacheco cited a comment by Grenier in the transcript as "unacceptable behavior" for a town employee.

An Inside Look at Triton History Teacher, Mr. Chad Richard

Mr. Chad Richard is well-known here at Triton and teaches Crimes against Humanity, Advanced Placement United States History (APUSH), and college-prep United States History.

A reporter from the Triton Voice wanted to take a closer look at Richard, who won Teacher of the Year for Triton last June and whose students say he is inspirational.

“Mr. Richard is an incredible example of what a teacher is supposed to be,” said senior Parker Harriott. Harriott stated that Richard’s teaching style will have a huge impact on how Harriott teaches if he becomes a teacher.

“And as someone who wants to be a history teacher myself,” said Harriott, “I know his teaching will influence my teaching in the future.”

Richard is very good at making bonds with his students. “He seems to genuinely care about his students,” said Harriott, “and makes an active effort to make connections with his students.”

Senior Oskar Fyrberg has had Richard’s classes twice in his high school career.

“When I look back at my high school career,” said Fyrberg, “my favorite classes were by far Mr. Richard’s

classes.”

Richard not only inspires future teachers, but he also inspires students to push themselves.

“Mr. Richard inspired and pushed me to go into AP History courses,” said Fyrberg, “and is the main reason I am in AP Euro (Advance Placement European History).”

But where did it all start? In Richard’s junior year in high school, he had a history teacher who inspired him. Richard had always enjoyed history in the first place.

“I really liked history,” said Richard.

“I always did.”

He is now in his 22nd year of teaching, and he enjoys every moment.

“Moments where a student just... gets it,” Richard said when asked what his favorite thing about teaching is. “You see it in their face, the moment where they go ‘Ah.’”

It’s been a big hit and Knock on Wood now does 10-15 senior center concerts a year. If you’ve never heard Elvis Presley’s “Don’t Be Cruel” arranged for guitar and mandolin or the Drifters’ “Save the Last Dance for Me” backed by a fiddle, you might want to check it out.

Newman, who has a real knack for engaging audiences, will mix in a few of his funny original songs, too, including one about becoming a grandfather for the first time and another about spending a weekend at a yoga retreat.

“We’re not the traditional guitar-and-fiddle duo,” says Newman. “Joe and I like to keep things up-tempo, do some songs people know and get the audience involved. The idea is to play some great music and have fun.”

repeatedly with angry statements and name calling, Lawler said Therrien, who has been on the ConCom for 14 years, "has no ability to lead," and "We do not know where she lives." He blamed her, not the technology department, for not getting her town email fixed.

Therrien objected to what she described as Lawler's "lies." She said she lives in Georgetown, but for safety reasons does not have to state publicly where she lives. "You are not entitled to know where I live," she said.

State law allows town officials to hide their home addresses.

Therrien was divorced last fall from her husband, Robert Bancroft. She declined in family court to give her ex-husband her new address, citing her concerns.

Her residency has become an issue since Kevin Wood, a frequent critic in town of the ConCom, posted - in what has been called a personal attack - on social media where he believes Therrien lives.

She also told the ConCom that after two months of trying to get her town email repaired, the technology (IT) firm had sorted out what it called a complicated problem. And it was not her fault, the head of the company told her.

Lawler was upset that the February meeting was continued by the chair because there was not a quorum to vote. He said there was a quorum.

Minutes before the February meeting was to start, the conservation

agent reported to Therrien that there were not enough members attending the meeting. The chair postponed the meeting, she said, to keep from wasting time and the town's money because the commission could not vote on projects on the agenda.

Lawler, who is also the chair of the town's water commission, wanted the ConCom to vote on a multiple building project for the department. When the vote was delayed a month, he got irate.

At the meeting last week, he voted to approve the project, although he is chair of the water board.

LaMonica said he voted to remove Therrien as chair of the ConCom because she also sits on the SelectBoard. He said he believes she could be a member of the ConCom, but not its chair. "It just doesn't look right," LaMonica said.

The State Ethics Board has written to Therrien that there is no state law prohibiting her from serving on two boards.

Another SelectBoard member Mike Donahue, who has attacked Therrien, serves as chair of the town's Park and Recreation Commission.

Donahue, a first-year Selectman, has been trying for years to remove Therrien from the SelectBoard. Currently on the agenda is his complaint against her, complete with 195 pages of memos, emails and police reports.

Most of the memos, emails and reports do not involve Therrien, although Donahue claims they provide evidence of her wrongdoing.

"(Y)ou mention that in talking about the Town Administrator that 'It's your f... job'."

The agent, a longtime municipal volunteer and employee, was criticizing Pacheco because software to allow employees to work on their personal computers remotely had not been installed. During the snow days recently, Pacheco told the employees they should work remotely.

The brief comment about Pacheco had nothing to do with the continued ConCom meeting.

Grenier did not know she was being recorded. Except for a few lines, the three-page transcript chronicles Grenier telling ConCom board members the meeting was continued for lack of a quorum.

Pacheco also cited a previous disciplinary action from last year against Grenier for filing what was called a false mileage expense report. Having had her driver's license suspended, she rode in the private car of the former ConCom chair to visit sites the commission was reviewing.

She said she gave the expense money, about \$40, to the former chair for using her car and had reimbursed the town for those payments. After an extensive meeting before the town's selectboard, where she explained her actions, she continued in her job for the past year.

Grenier also has fought with Pacheco, who serves as the town's human resources director, when he lowered her salary. When hired, she was told she was also to serve as the conservation agent for the town of Essex. After a few months, when Essex withdrew from that arrangement, Pacheco cut her salary.

Black Swan Golf Club

The SelectBoard recently approved the transfer of one of two liquor licenses at the Black Swan Country Club to its new owners, Walden Corp. Golf, doing business as Black Swan Equities. The liquor license is for the two function halls, but not Flatbread Pizza, which was also acquired.

David Carlson, the manager, said Walden "likes public golf courses." It owns 25 courses nationally and three in Massachusetts, Stow Acres Country Club in Stow and Blackstone National Golf Club in Sutton as well as Black Swan.
