

Town to Review ConCom Agent Abrupt Firing

GEORGETOWN – The SelectBoard voted unanimously last week to consider whether Town Administrator Orlando Pacheco followed proper procedure in firing Conservation Commission Director Michele Grenier.

Chair Robert Hoover said the board will review the firing in executive session at the next SelectBoard meeting that has time on the agenda. Although the issue was not on the board's agenda last week, SelectBoard member Mike Donahue made the motion to consider Grenier's dismissal, saying he wanted to make sure her dismissal was done correctly.

Donahue told *The Town Common* after the meeting that he pushed for the review of the firing to make certain "all the rules were followed." It is unclear if under the current form of town government that the town administrator has the authority to fire employees without the consent of the SelectBoard. (See story on page 2 of new town charter exploration committee.)

Grenier was hired by the ConCom, but the commission has not met on her proposed dismissal. There appeared to be no one acting on ConCom projects now that the director was fired.

The ConCom agent was fired by Pacheco by e-mail and certified mail on a Friday when Town Hall was closed. There was no meeting or vote by the SelectBoard on this termination, which appears to violate the town's

Should Georgetown Explore a New Charter?

GEORGETOWN – The Select-Board is considering whether this town should be governed under a different charter than the one it has and will be looking for nine volunteers to form an exploratory committee and prepare a final report to help the BoS decide what if it's worth further looking into.

"This is a once in a lifetime opportunity to serve your community and make a real long-lasting difference," wrote SelectBoard Chair Robert Hoover. The goal, he said, is to "find the best form of government that best fits our town."

Georgetown is currently governed by a Town Meeting of town residents that meets at least once

year and a five-member elected SelectBoard that meets usually twice a month. Day-to-day operations are run by a Town Administrator, appointed by the SelectBoard.

The charter exploratory committee, appointed by the SelectBoard, will be asked to investigate if a new charter can help the town government function more efficiently and effectively. It will make a recommendation to the SelectBoard if looking into a new charter is it worth pursuing.

"Not all our local government issues are charter related," Hoover wrote. But he said he believes that Georgetown has "Too many problems to correct with new bylaws alone."

Thirteen years ago, the Town of

Georgetown, Financial Management Review, Division of Local Services/Technical Assistance Section wrote: "The Town of Georgetown has a relatively sound financial foundation, and municipal government functions reasonably well. However, its present condition is not the by-product of a well-organized town government. Success has been achieved despite the current system and is due instead to the willingness of individuals to make a decentralized government structure work."

Under the current form of government, the conclusion was that "The town's government is decentralized, with 12 (today it's 23) separately elected and appointed boards and officials. There is no one board or official that can be held truly accountable and responsible for the overall management and financial well-being of the community. It is not an environment where coordinated solutions are easily developed."

New IRS Data: More Than 150,000 Residents Left Massachusetts

BOSTON – The Mass Opportunity Alliance (MOA) highlighted the findings of the latest Internal Revenue Service (IRS) "Statistics of Income" data, which shows steep taxes continue to fuel the state's outmigration crisis.

Released last week, the report provides data for 2023, the first year the income surtax – also known as the "millionaire's tax" – took effect in the commonwealth. The figures include the number of people who moved to and from Massachusetts, and their total adjusted gross income (AGI), respectively.

"This data confirms that Massachusetts is losing talent and taxable income to lower-cost, lower-tax competitors," said MOA spokesperson Colin Reed. "These numbers validate what anecdotal evidence – and commonsense – have been telling us all along: high state taxes, including the income surtax, are driving people away from Massachusetts."

Key findings from the new IRS data include:

- In 2023, Massachusetts experienced a net migration of -30,460, with 150,394 leaving the Commonwealth and 119,934 people moving to the state.
- Since the surtax went into place, the Bay State's year-over-year AGI loss increased. For context, Massachusetts lost \$11.88 billion AGI in 2023, translating to a net loss of -\$4.18 billion compared to -\$3.9 billion in 2022. This jump suggests that high-earners made up a sizable portion of those leaving the state.
- Key competitor states gained residents from Massachusetts, including Florida (net increase of 7,879), New Hampshire (net increase of 7,000), and North Carolina (net increase of 2,546) – all lower-cost, lower-tax destinations.





bylaw which states: "In his capacity, the Town Administrator, upon approval by the Board of Selectmen, shall have the authority to carry out the following functions, including but not limited to: A. Appointment and removal of employees."

Hoover told The Town Common that K&P Law, the law firm on retainer to the town, that it found the firing to have been done properly.

In a letter she is preparing for the SelectBoard members, Grenier wrote there was no cause for her dismissal. "I did not withhold information, did not have an exit interview, or a detailed discussions with a selectman, a conservation member, Orlando and me. As, the select people were not aware. The select people are Orlando's boss."

Pacheco fired Grenier, the only ConCom staff, by letter two weeks ago for unspecified behaviors related to a continued ConCom meeting. She was also fired for allegedly concealing a transcript of a Zoom recording of her conversations prior to the meeting.

It is unclear if an investigation was conducted into causes that led to her firing.

"He's been looking for a reason to fire me," Grenier said. She has since contacted two attorneys to help her assess her options.

In the termination letter, Pacheco cited a comment by Grenier in the transcript as "unacceptable behavior" for a town employee. He wrote her, "(Y)ou mention that in talking about the Town Administrator that 'It's your f... job'."

The agent, a longtime municipal volunteer and employee, was recorded criticizing Pacheco because computer software to allow employees to work on their personal computers remotely had not been installed, which is his authority. During the snow days recently, Pacheco told the employees they should work remotely for two days, but without the software, that was not possible.

The brief comment about Pacheco had nothing to do with the continued ConCom meeting.

Grenier said she did not know she was being recorded on Zoom and said she did not know there was a transcript of the meeting. Except for a few lines criticizing Pacheco, the three-page transcript chronicles Grenier calling ConCom board

members to tell them the meeting was continued for lack of a quorum.

Pacheco also cited a previous disciplinary action against Grenier for filing what was called a false mileage expense report. Having had her driver's license suspended, Grenier rode in the private car of the former ConCom chair to do her job, visiting projects on sites the commission was reviewing for wetland violations and other issues.

She said she gave the mileage money, about \$40 she incurred over several months, to the former chair for using her car and had since reimbursed the town for those payments out of her pocket.

Grenier earlier fought with Pacheco, who serves as the town's human resources director, when he lowered her salary. When hired, she was told she was also to serve as the conservation agent for the town of Essex.

After a few months, when Essex withdrew from that arrangement, Pacheco cut her salary. ♦

Q: I saw a news story about Kim Delaney's personal life recently. I remember watching her on "All My Children" as Jenny when I was younger. Is she doing OK? Is she still acting? -- W.E.

A: The love story between Jenny and Greg is probably only second to Luke and Laura's in ABC daytime soap history. Kim Delaney earned a Daytime Emmy Award nomination for the role of Jenny Gardner on "All My Children" -- her first major role. Her time on "AMC" was brief for soap standards, only three years (1981-1984), before she pivoted her career to feature films.

While she never became a movie star, her career did take off once again when she was cast as Detective Diane Russell in the hit series "NYPD Blue." It was only supposed to be for four episodes, but fans (likely many who knew her from her soap opera days) responded well to her performance opposite Jimmy Smits' Detective Bobby Simone. She was then offered a contract and even won an Emmy in 1997 for the role.

Delaney left "GH" in 2021, and her last on-camera role was a recurring one on NBC's "Chicago Fire." She has no upcoming projects listed on her IMDb page at this time.
