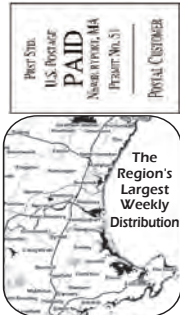

Boxford Brings the Colors Inside



Memorial Day Events Carry On

Rains cancelled many parades in the region, but in Boxford and Georgetown, like elsewhere, Memorial Day remembrance ceremonies shifted indoors, as together, we honored those veterans who gave their lives in defense of our liberties.

In Boxford, Ian M. Fitch, Commander of the James L. Melvin Post #379 American Legion welcomed all into the First Church Congregational in East Boxford Village. Members of the community streamed into the large venue, where Reverend Gene Heacock gave the Invocation, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Millan Ladd, senior patrol leader of Scout Troup 57. Members of the Masconomet High School Chorus sang the "National Anthem," followed by a reading of the first portion of the Declaration of Independence by Liam Judd, patrol leader of Scout Troop 51. The chorus then sang "America the Beautiful," before Chuck Costello, chair of the Boxford Select Board read the board's proclamation.

Meanwhile, in neighboring Georgetown, residents sheltered inside the bays of the Safety Building as Select Board Chair Doug Dawes, Commander of the Rene J. Gagnon Post #440 American Legion, gave introductory remarks and led his neighbors through a mock-parade, with the virtual honor stops at memorials along the way, introducing speakers at what would have been an outdoor traditional gathering.

Members of the Police Department Honor Guard, Fire Department, American Legion, local scouts,

members of the high school band, and veterans joined in to pay respects. In addition to readings, Taps, and veterans standing outside the bays in the elements firing their salute, Commander Dawes took time to remind us to work together in challenging times, recognized recently departed veterans, and also related

that "you die twice," once when you physically die, and the second time when no one says your name. He noted that as they decorate the graves of the fallen, they say out loud each veteran's name, so that they are always remembered, and live on. ♦

Boxford Transitions Emergency Calls to North Shore Regional 911

BOXFORD –The Town of Boxford officially transitioned emergency dispatch operations to the North Shore Regional 911 Center (NSR911) last week. Boxford's transition to NSR911 followed nearly two years of planning, evaluation, and implementation work. During the first year, town officials and public safety leadership conducted feasibility analysis and operational review of regional emergency communications options. Last summer, the Boxford Select Board entered into a Memorandum of Agreement with NSR911 for Boxford to become the regional center's 11th member community. Over the past year, town staff, NSR911 personnel, and Boxford public safety departments worked collaboratively on operational planning, equipment installation, training, testing, and implementation coordination.

All emergency 911 calls and public safety dispatch operations for the Town of Boxford are being handled by NSR911 on behalf of the Boxford Police and Fire Departments.

Residents should continue to dial 911 for emergencies. Boxford Police and Fire Department non-emergency business phone numbers remain unchanged, and Police, Fire, and EMS response services within Boxford remain unchanged.

The Police Station lobby will remain open and accessible to the public 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. During periods when

Piano Concert to Benefit Newburyport's Historic Belleville Meetinghouse

NEWBURYPORT – Belleville Church will host piano soloist Sergei Novikov on Sunday, May 31 at 4 p.m. for a concert benefiting the fundraising efforts to reopen the historic Belleville Meetinghouse. Music will include classical, jazz, Broadway tunes, and more. Tickets are available at the door for a suggested donation of \$25. Cash and credit cards accepted.

Since immigrating from Russia to the United States in 1990, Novikov has become a major force in contemporary composing and has a large following. His music reflects influences and nuances of classical, jazz, Spanish, Latin, Russian, blues, tango, electronica and other styles. The Boston Globe said he: "brings an intelligence, craft and elegance to his arrangements...his music is both accessible to the unschooled ear and complex enough to hold the interest of the classical music appreciator." Novikov opened a program for First Lady Barbara Bush and has performed for dignitaries and celebrities including President George

H.W. Bush, Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice, President Joe Biden, Billy Joel, Paul Newman and Reba McEntire.

The Belleville Meetinghouse dedicated in 1867, is a prominent landmark on High Street and a valued example of New England religious architecture. It has evolved into a shared resource for worship, music, and community events for the greater Newburyport community offering "the best acoustics on the North Shore" and seating for 600 audience members. For decades it has been home to the Newburyport Choral Society, Belleville Roots Music Series, theater productions, organ concerts, weddings and other community events.

The church temporarily closed the Meetinghouse until a restoration project is completed that will stabilize and repair the ceiling structure for generations to come. Belleville and its community partners are currently raising funds to reopen this treasured venue. Learn more at www.bellevillechurch.org. ♦

staff are not physically present in the lobby area, visitors may communicate directly with NSR911 personnel through an intercom system.

Over the past several years, Boxford has evaluated opportunities to regionalize certain municipal services with neighboring communities where doing so improves operational resiliency, expands available resources, and enhances long-term sustainability. In public safety communications specifically, regional dispatch models have become increasingly common across Massachusetts due to the technology, training, staffing, and coordination demands of modern emergency communications systems. Regional dispatch operations also

provide greater redundancy and operational continuity during major incidents, severe weather events, or staffing shortages.

With the transition, Boxford joins Amesbury, Essex, Groveland, Hamilton, Manchester-by-the-Sea, Middleton, North Reading, Rowley, Topsfield, and Wenham as member communities served by NSR911.

"NSR911 gives our officers and firefighters access to additional resources, advanced dispatcher training, and modern emergency communications technology," said Police Chief James Riter. "This is a strong long-term move for public safety in Boxford, and residents should continue to expect the same professional police and emergency response services they rely on today."

"This transition represents an important investment in the future

of emergency communications and public safety services for the Town of Boxford," said Fire Chief Brian Geiger. "NSR911 provides additional resources, redundancy, and specialized emergency dispatch capabilities that support both our firefighters and the residents we serve. We are confident this regional partnership will enhance emergency response coordination and service delivery for the community."

The transition also concludes operations of the Town's standalone Communications Department, following decades of dedicated service to the community by Boxford's dispatch personnel.

"This transition was not a reflection of the professionalism or performance of our Communications Department staff," said Town Administrator Matt Coogan. "Boxford has benefited from an exceptionally dedicated and professional dispatch team

over many years. Their institutional knowledge, professionalism, and commitment to public safety have been deeply appreciated by the Town, our residents, and our first responders".

The Town expressed appreciation to retired Communications Director Warren Gould for assisting with transition planning and implementation following his retirement, as well as the many Police, Fire, Communications, Town Hall, State 911 Department, and NSR911 personnel who contributed to the transition effort.

TA's Hiring and Firing ConCom Agents?

GEORGETOWN – The town's Conservation Committee will hold a special meeting Thursday to discuss hiring a director to replace Michele Grenier, who was fired by Town Administrator Orlando Pacheco in a controversial action that left a key town board with no staff.

The issue, which was intensely debated at the ConCom meeting last week, is whether the Georgetown town administrator has the authority to hire and fire the commission's agent.

State law, Mass Gen Laws 40C, states: The (conservation) may appoint a director, clerks, consultants and other employees, and may contract for materials and services within available funds insofar as the same are not supplied by other departments.

It does not provide for the SelectBoard or the town administrator to appoint a director or any ConCom employees. Town's conservation commissions report directly to the state Department of Environmental Protection.

Without consulting or approval by the ConCom, Pacheco hired Rockport conservation agent John Lopez as a temporary consulting agent for five to seven hours per week. Lopez attended the ConCom meeting last week and tried to speak once, but was not recognized.

ConCom chair Rachel Therrien told Lopez earlier that he had not being hired as the conservation agent, setting up another conflict between the town administrator and the ConCom. The ConCom has formed a hiring subcommittee to begin screening applicants for the ConCom agent position.

The work of the commission, which oversees the town's wetlands, has had no staff since Grenier's firing. The permitting work is being done by the chair and vice chair Amy Graffum, two volunteers.

On one project involving the town's water department, the permits were left at the police station so at least four commission members could sign them. But Pacheco, who was vacationing in the Dominican Republic, had the paperwork, with only three commissioners' signatures, removed from the police station, which stays open 24 hours a day, and left in the locked commission office where it was not accessible.

Without the fourth signature, the work being performed by engineering firm Tighe and Bond was delayed for several days.

Grenier was fired on Friday, March 18, without approval of the SelectBoard or the ConCom, which hired her. She had staffed the ConCom since Nov. 27, 2023.

"I can confirm we are in receipt of the letter and the matter has been forwarded to our insurance company as the appropriate protocol. They have assigned the appropriate personnel and will handle the matter moving forward," Pacheco wrote.

Pacheco also serves as the town's human resources director, which means any complaints by employees of discrimination or other wrongs would be inves-

tigated by him.

In the termination letter, Grenier was fired for allegedly concealing a transcript of a Zoom recording of her conversations prior to the meeting. Grenier said that she never concealed any transcript.

Pacheco also cited a recorded comment by Grenier in the transcript as "unacceptable behavior" for a town employee. He wrote her, "(Y)ou mention that in talking about the Town Administrator that 'It's your f... job'." She was complaining that he had not given town employees computer software so they could work remotely during last winter's ice storms.

Last week, Pacheco told The Town Common that he had not fired Grenier for questioning his job performance, although he wrote in the termination letter that he had.

When Pacheco was asked by the SelectBoard if he had cleared the firing of Grenier with legal counsel, the town administrator said he had consulted "legal." Board members assumed he meant the law firm K&P Law on retainer with the town.

Pacheco has since acknowledged that he hired a different law firm, Murphy, Hesse, Twomey & Lahane, without approval of the SelectBoard. The firm's opinion on the town administrator's authority over the hiring and firing of town employees has not been made public.

The administrator's hiring of a different law firm than K&P Law prompted SelectBoard member Mike Donahue to file an emergency Open Meeting Law complaint.

Grenier's attorney Simon Mann wrote: "The Town's actions have caused Ms. Grenier significant financial harm and emotional distress and constitute clear violations of Massachusetts law." ♦
